# "Lend a Hand, Do What You Can": Remembering the Generosity of Gander

On September 11, 2001, airline passenger Jacqueline Pinto was flying home to New York from a vacation in Italy when her plane was unexpectedly diverted to Gander International Airport in Newfoundland, Canada. Hers was one of more than 250 flights rerouted after U.S. airspace was closed in response to the terrorist attacks. Thirty-eight of those flights landed in Gander.

Initially unaware of the severity of the situation, Pinto and her fellow passengers were confined to their aircraft for more than 24 hours while security protocols were followed. When they were finally cleared to disembark, they faced another challenge: Gander and surrounding towns didn't have enough hotel rooms for the nearly 7,000 unexpected guests. The local population of just under 10,000 responded with remarkable compassion.

Community television issued the call to "lend a hand, do what you can." Schools and nonessential businesses shut down so that residents—from seniors to schoolchildren—could volunteer. Locals opened churches, schools, and legion halls to serve as makeshift shelters. Some even welcomed passengers into their own homes. Pinto and her fellow travelers were housed in a church in the nearby town of Lewisporte.

The generosity didn't stop at shelter. Pharmacies filled prescriptions free of charge. Toiletries, clothing, and food poured in. A local ice rink was transformed into "the largest walk-in freezer in the country," according to Gander Mayor Claude Elliott. Locals also worked to entertain the "plane people," organizing bowling nights, concerts, and town tours—and introducing visitors to Newfoundland specialties like stewed moose.

Despite their own modest means, Newfoundlanders saw their actions as nothing extraordinary. "For us, it was just every day," said local reporter Janice Goudie. "You don't turn your backs on people in need."

When U.S. airspace reopened on September 13, tearful goodbyes followed. "We didn't want to leave," one passenger recalled. Before departing on September 15, Pinto purchased a small tile at the airport as a keepsake of the kindness she experienced.

Many of the stranded passengers remained in touch with their Newfoundland hosts. Some returned for reunions. The passengers of one flight even established a scholarship fund for local students, which has grown from an initial \$15,000 donation to over \$1 million, benefiting more than 200 recipients.

The people of Newfoundland also carry the memory of those days. In Appleton, a Peace Park was built with funds donated by stranded passengers. It includes a monument to first responders and a piece of steel from the World Trade Center. Each year on 9/11, Appleton holds a remembrance ceremony. "There is goodness in the world," said Appleton Mayor Derm Flynn, "that floats to the top in times of disaster."


