Clintonians in the cast and crew. Natalie Pace, 11, a Lovett Elementary student, brings her own MC theater experience to New Stage. She plays Salt and Pepper and the Sausage Curl Girl in the ensemble.

"I love *Beauty and the Beast*. It's just my favorite princess of all," said Pace.

"I love the songs that we sing. It sounds really good, like the movies," she says, expressing a particular fondness for dialogues between Lumiere and Babette. "It's just funny!"

Michael Kinslow of Clinton, who plays Gaston's Crony, the Baker in the ensemble, and a Wolf, is in his first large-scale musical.

"This has all been kind of a crash course," he says, of singing melodies, singing backup and dancing. "I have to say my favorite part, as of today, right now, is the wolf choreography — the fight scene between the Beast and myself and the other wolves, and then also attacking Belle, and that's been fun!" He relishes the challenge of bringing a four-legged creature to life on two legs, in 3-D.

The tale's enchantment is at the heart of its appeal.

"You have someone being a candlestick. You have someone being a clock," Kinslow says, and even before costumes, you can tell. "They have those mannerisms. If a candlestick could walk, this is what they would do. If a clock was alive, this is how it would be. A wardrobe or a teapot ... just to see them

come to life."

"I've played everything from a drug dealer to a murderer, but how often does someone say, 'All right, listen. I'm going to need you to be a teapot?' ... So, to see that come to life, it's very enchanting. It's magical, from the audience standpoint, obviously. But just as an actor — to see the other actors do that and go, 'Wow!'"

The show's music direction is by Carol Joy Sparkman of Clinton, who's also director of choirs at Clinton High. *Beauty and the Beast* is a fairytale people have fallen in love with, she says. And although it's not a specifically Christmas story, "at Christmas time, people are looking for all the things that make you feel good," from happy endings to giving of yourself and exchanging presents.

"*Beauty and the Beast* is that kind of story. Two people find this happiness in a place they didn't expect to find it. ... It's just that fuzzy good feeling that we all like to have — *Beauty and the Beast* brings that out."

"We know families are looking for things to do, and this is the type of show that appeals to every generation," director Francine Thomas Reynolds says. "The theme of finding what's beautiful inside, as opposed what's on the outside, I think really is appropriate for this particular holiday season."

"This time of year, we're looking for that type of thing. We're looking for goodness in people."
