DIRECTOR'S NOTE

"OMG PLEASE TELL ME YOU'VE READ THE MOORS!?" is the text I sent to my close friend and scene partner three scenes into the play you're about to see. I was enjoying a porch-sit in early fall of my senior year at Winthrop University getting ahead on my homework for Acting II, in which I was assigned to do a scene study as Huldey from Scene 11 of Jen Silverman's *The Moors*.

My fascination grew as I read on and discovered how nuanced a play could be: absurdity with a compelling plot; character-objective-driven story with music that gives insight into those characters, but not a musical; portraying hard-hitting truths from the mouths of larger-than-life characters. I was moved. *The Moors* is a play I wish I wrote. I wanted to portray every character, design every element, and direct a million productions. Luckily, my professor and scene partner shared in my geekout.

When I was told to propose a play for this season of the Unframed at New Stage Theatre Series, I immediately knew I was going to propose *The Moors*. I have never directed anything, so taking this project on was exhilarating. I feel like my experience as an actor and observer of my acting professors' coaching uniquely suit this play. Each character has a distinct and intense objective that they need to play, which largely drives the blocking. The cast understood this idea, so my role in rehearsals was largely posing questions about motivation, tactics, and breaking points. They truly are all superstars and I am so proud that they are my first cast.

Thank you especially to Mackenzie Joy and Rachel Dawson, without whom I would not have a play to nerd out over this intensely and whose direction style influenced how I am trying out this new facet of my art.

I'd also love to acknowledge you, the audience. I have found that you are a character of your own in any play, and you are the final ingredient that makes live theatre magical. Thank you for being here.
