

DIRECTOR'S NOTES

WE NEED TO TALK is fiction. It is based very loosely on the story of Abraham and Sarah as told in the Bible, in the book of Genesis (Chpt. 11, Verse 26-Chpt. 22). At the start of this project in the late eighties (yes THAT long!) I tried to encompass the entire story of Abraham's journey with his wife Sarah as told in the Good Book. After offering a copy to a cherished friend, Ivan Rider, he suggested that I whittle it down to a manageable tale. Ultimately, I decided to only include the personal challenge of Abraham and Sarah at the expense of the rest of this immense story. Immense is, of course, an understatement in that it is the seed of three great religions in this world today (Jewish, Christian, Islam). And by "only include," I mean just that. I concentrated only on those two people, Abraham and Sarah, as they navigated their relationship through impossible odds. What was it like to be given an impossible "mission" from an "impossible source" out in the fields one day? What was it like to have to tell family that they were to "pick up and leave" without warning of any kind to be led into a famine? The story is rife with challenges all through this impossible story...up to the ultimate challenge of possible human sacrifice. Anachronisms abound. Tomatoes? Knitting? But this is not a story about that. This is a story about a universal struggle, modern and ancient, in handling what fated results gives us in challenge. If we are human, we make mistakes, as Abraham and Sarah certainly do. Ultimately what are we, as human beings on this planet, expected to be? I am a man of devout faith. But even without that, what are we in this universe we live in? Are we no better than our own failure, or can we rise above that to be the impossible? I think this, as much as anything, is what this "tale told" is about. Hope you enjoy. - John

JOSEPH FROST (Abraham #2) is a playwright, director and actor living in Jackson, MS, with his wife Shannon and five kids. He has performed in 75 productions, written 20 plays, and specializes in devised theatre. Joseph is the artistic director of the floodlight theatre company and is the Lead Theatre Arts Teacher at Ida B. Wells Academic and Performing Arts Complex. He previously appeared in FTW productions of *Arcadia, Dinner With Friends, Assassins*, and *The Bald Soprano*, as well as New Stage productions of *Twelfth Night, Tuesdays with Morrie, The Trip to Bountiful, Dead Man's Cell Phone, Million Dollar Quartet, And Then There Were None*, and *The Crucible*.

MAC MITCHELL (Abraham #1) is an actor and playwright from Jackson, Mississippi who teaches at Belhaven University and at Saint Augustine School, where he devises new plays and adaptations with students from 4th-12th grade. He is also an MFA student at the Hollins University Playwright's Lab. He played Father in Belhaven University's production of Eurydice, Ferdinand with MS Shakespeare Festival's production of *The Tempest*, and also appeared in John Maxwell's *A Christmas Tale*.

WENDIE SHEPPARD (Sarah #3) is making her FTW debut with this performance. She previously appeared in New Stage's Unframed production of BOY. Other acting credits include Pat Nixon in the SETC award-winning show, *Tea for Three*, and Elizabeth Taylor in *Aunt Jane of Kentucky*, where she was recognized for an "Outstanding Feature Performance" at the 2023 Mississippi Theater Festival.
