DIRECTOR'S NOTE

We are pleased to introduce Dominique Morisseau to the New Stage audience with this production of her powerful, passionate and intelligent new play *Pipeline*. Morisseau's plays are quickly becoming some of the most produced throughout the country. *Pipeline* is the fourth most produced play in America's regional theatres this season.

I am excited for our audiences to see *Pipeline* because it asks big questions. The characters are caught in a tug of war between the idea of how our country and our educational system should work to serve all students equally versus the reality.

Morisseau welcomes the debate around the questions *Pipeline* raises. In an American Theatre magazine article discussing the play, she was asked if the conversation the work spawns is as important as the work.

"Absolutely. I tell people, you can talk about me behind my back all you want to. That's your right. I have to protect myself—I don't need to hear all of it—but once you've experienced the play, you have every right to discuss it, or it's not a fair exchange," she replied. "I come from mentors who say the best plays do more asking of questions than they do answering them. So, when I go, "I'm going to ask some questions," I got to then let the people answer them, or what am I asking for? If I'm going to ask questions, I need to let people have answers at some point."*

While *Pipeline* doesn't provide instructions for audiences to solve the "have and have-not" ecosystem of American education, Morisseau hopes her suggestions begin a conversation in her audience of educators, non-educators, and youth while she has them in the same room.

"Conversation around the work is the next part of the work. I'm a community-driven artist, so my work will never be just for me or just for people to witness and not be able to respond to," said Morisseau." *

I don't think our teachers are given enough recognition. This production is dedicated to teachers. Thank you for all you do.
