



THE POWER OF PLACE

Dear Theatre Lover.

A house in suburban Atlanta; an attic in Amsterdam; a river levee in Mississippi; a bar in Pennsylvania; and the North Carolina Blue Ridge Mountains. These are the remarkable locations represented in our 53rd season of plays selected to entertain, impact, and inspire as they illustrate "The Power of Place."

The season opens with a new comedy written by Mississippi's own award-winning playwright Topher Payne. Morningside will take the audience to an upscale house in Atlanta one bright, sunny afternoon. Shrewd, witty and razor sharp, this hilarious spin on modern motherhood asks if one's family house is a place to call home.

As vital today as when it was first written, the classic Diary of Anne Frank is the second play in our season. Anne's chronicle of courage and terror created an enduring place in history for the Frank family. Based on the original play, this new adaption by Wendy Kesselman brings us into the secret annex where 13-year-old Anne and seven other Jews evade Nazi deportation.

Set in Mississippi, our third play of the season has characters stranded on a levee in search of a new landing place. Written by Marcus Gardley and based on actual events, Hell in High Water is a new play with blues music that revisits the Greenville, Mississippi flood of 1927. New Stage Theatre has been awarded a grant from the National Endowment for the Arts to produce Hell in High Water and will partner with area organizations to present special community events during its January and February performances.

It will be followed by the regional premiere of *Sweat*, the 2017 Pulitzer Prize winning and Broadway hit play. The author, Lynn Nottage, was searching for a place that exemplified what she calls the "deindustrialized revolution" and she found it in Reading, Pennsylvania. Told with both humor and tremendous heart, the action is in a fictional bar and takes us to the heart of working-class America.

Closing out the season will be Bright Star, a beautiful musical written by Steve Martin and Edie Brickell. Amid the workings of a literary magazine in the mid-1940s, this sweet Bluegrass musical, takes place in the Blue Ridge Mountains of North Carolina. A young man's yearning for a place results in long held secrets being revealed. Romantic, pure and called "an antidote for cynical times," Bright Star is perfect for our Jackson area audiences and closes our "Power of Place" season delightfully.

We will also be offering additional productions including a traditional holiday favorite *A Christmas Carol*, and a special production of the new, Mississippi-bred, musical comedy Sweet Potato Queens.

The characters in this season's plays yearn and search for home, redefine place and struggle for identity in the changing worlds around them. A strong impression of place can evoke anger, joy, tears, and laughter. At New Stage Theatre we know there is a place for everyone, and I invite you to join us for our 53rd season and experience "The Power of Place" portraued by some of the finest theatre artists available. I look forward to seeing you in the audience.

New Stage's education program is designed to introduce young Mississippians to live theatre of substance and imagination. Included are School Fest Matinees of mainstage shows, a touring program, workshops for both teachers and students, acting classes, summer camps and an apprenticeship program.

The 2018-19 schedule of shows and programs offer several opportunities for youth involvement. New Stage Theatre's touring productions and matinee productions played for more than 29,000 people during the last school year. The touring productions travel to schools, libraries, and community centers statewide. The touring shows for the 2018-19 year will be *Fairy Tale Theatre* for elementary age students, and *Freedom Summer: Mississippi*, a play with music featuring pivotal moments in the Civil Rights movement for middle and high school students.
