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DIRECTORS NOTE

"Don't miss the parade cause it's passing!"

I've been thinking a lot about parades. When I was a kid I was over-the-top, obsessed with parades. Inspired by Brookhaven's annual Christmas Parade, I would stage elaborate lineups with my toys around and under my twin beds - floats made from Lincoln Logs and Tinker Toys, plastic cowboys and army men marched in formation, GI Joe was my grand marshal. In the dead of winter, I decorated my lime green Schwinn Stingray with multi-colored toilet paper flowers to lead my own Rose Parade in our gravel driveway. Scout, our kingly German Shepherd, proudly wore a handmade floral collar. When I moved to New York, I volunteered to be a balloon handler and marched in the Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade. Clifford the Big Red Dog nearly got the best of me that blustery Thursday morning. I went on to work as a music director for the Macy's Parade for a number of years. I even made my Broadway debut in a new musical at Lincoln Center called - you guessed it - Parade. So it seems that I've always had a thing for parades. And now I find myself at the helm of another parade! Now, if I'm being honest, even though I grew up just 50 miles south of Jackson, I'd never heard of the Sweet Potato Queens until Francine asked me to direct the musical celebrating one of Jackson's most renowned icons, Jill Conner Browne. For the past seven months I've been immersed in SPQ-land. I drank the Kool-Aid (or the Mad Dog) and now I've added Jill's hilarious books to a growing stack of my favorite Mississippi writers: Lewis Nordan, Eudora Welty, Mary Miller, Jesmyn Ward, Nick White, and Angie Thomas, to name a few. Jill challenges us all to "do what makes our heart sing." My heart has sung a lot of different songs since I was a kid dreaming up parades and putting on shows in my Bogue Chitto bedroom. Coming home to Mississippi makes my heart sing - especially when I get to work with such tremendously talented theater artists. I bow down to the trio of legendary, award-winning writers who've brought these singin' and dancin' Mississippi Queens to the stage here in Jackson. I am in awe of our brilliant cast and wildly imaginative creative team. And I'm eternally grateful to Francine and everyone at New Stage for the opportunity to work a little magic on this stage. When I accepted this extraordinary challenge, I promised to deliver a show full of laughter and love. As you are waiting for our fantastical, fever-dream parade to kick off, make me a promise: forget your troubles, give your loved one (or whoever you came with) a big smooch, and ask yourself what would YOU do to be an SPQ!

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All I ever wanted to be in this life was 5'2", with long red hair, green eyes, large breasts, and little feet—and to be able to sing. Never got ANY of it and because I never got anything that I wanted, I spent a great deal of my youth feeling like I didn't get ANYthing. Not a good place to be. This problem was exacerbated by my childhood Sunday School teachers' endless teaching of the Parable of the Talents—in which SOME got more than others—but EVERYBODY got at LEAST ONE. I thought that I was surely the exception to this.

I grew up and had a job that I hated but I loved the man that I worked for: Frank Mastronardi, a self-proclaimed Positive Mental Attitude Junkie. Thanks to Mr. M, I heard every word ever spoken by Zig Ziglar, Norman Vincent Peale and the like and one thing that they ALL said in common that really resonated for me personally was that "you should DO what makes your HEART SING, and the money will follow." But, I was 19 and working in the Credit Department at Sears so the heart-singing did not commence there and then.

Later, I discovered I was gifted in a few areas, for instance: smiling, waving, forming baseless opinions and bossing people around. After seeing photographs that showed a strong facial resemblance between my ADOPTED Mama and Queen Elizabeth of England, I made the totally logical assumption that I must be a long-lost royal relative but that did not prove true. However, I did know from that moment on that I was put here to BE a Queen. After all, what else have you ever seen any Queen do BUT smile and wave?

In the early 1980's, there was a Divine Cosmic Convergence wherein I heard about the Sweet Potato Festival in Vardaman, Mississippi and thought what a delight it would be to serve as the Queen of that—but it involves a pageant for which I was, even then, far too old and nowhere near pretty enough. Then,

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at almost the same moment, I heard that Malcolm White was putting on the first ever St. Paddy's Parade here in Jackson and I said, with no hesitation whatsoever, "I'M IN IT." My best friend and Malcolm's wife, Vivian asked, somewhat derisively, "What are you gonna be?" As IF I had no plan and I replied, "I AM THE SWEET POTATO QUEEN," Vivian said, "So am I" and for the first few years, ANYBODY who was willing to

put on a green ball gown
from the Goodwill,
ride in the back of a
pickup truck, smile,
wave, and throw
sweet potatoes to the
confused populace of
Downtown Jackson—
could BE a Sweet Potato
Queen and there were not
as many takers as one might
expect for such an outstanding
opportunity.

Today, there are over 6,400
Chapters of Sweet Potato Queen®
Wannabe™ groups in 37 countries
and it is STILL the Best Job I Ever Had.
I did say, out loud, that very first year,
"SOMEbody will PAY me to do THIS!"
because it absolutely made my heart sing
then—and it still does, every single year. So,
thanks for all that Positive advice, Mr. M!

PAUL HEINDL (Drums) received his Bachelor and Master of Music Performance from The University of Mississippi where he was active in many of the university instrumental ensembles. He has been teaching and writing for percussion sections across the state of Mississippi since he was 17. Heindl is an active clinician, adjudicator and performer and has played with the Corinth, Meridian and Mississippi Symphony Orchestras as well as the Mississippi Wind Symphony. RICHARD BROWN (Bass) earned his Masters of Music degree in performance from DePaul University and his Bachelor of Music Education degree from the University of Memphis. He was a full time member of the Memphis Symphony at the age of 19. His 21 year teaching experience includes teaching in New Orleans, St. Louis, and Chicago. He is an adjunct professor of acoustic and electric bass at Belhaven University and performs with the Mississippi Symphony Orchestra. He has toured internationally as a classical, jazz and cruise ship musician. He has recorded with Grammy winner, Cassandra Wilson and others.

JIMMY TURNER (Guitar) earned his Bachelors of Music and Masters in Music in guitar performance degrees from the University of Southern Mississippi. Turner maintains an active private studio, performance schedule, and serves as an adjunct faculty member at Millsaps College and teaches guitar at Mississippi College. His students have won top honors and prizes in local and state competitions. Turner has played in New Stage Theatre's productions of *The Robber Bridegroom*, It Ain't Nothin' but the Blues, Breaking Up Is Hard to Do, Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat, The Marvelous Wonderettes, Hairspray, Shrek The Musical, and One Man, Two Guvnors.

TIM WALKER (Rehearsal Music Director/Accompanist) is a native of Jackson, but spent the majority of his childhood years in Wiggins, Miss. Walker's music career began in ninth grade, when he became pianist of his local church. He is a graduate of William Carey University in Hattiesburg with Bachelor's degrees in Biology and Chemistry. Walker holds a Master of Music in conducting from New Orleans Baptist Seminary where he is currently pursuing a Doctorate in Music. Walker's life in music has taken him from church to stage. He previously severed

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as Conductor of The Acadiana Symphony Youth Orchestra in Lafayette, LA and also severed as Conductor for Lafayette's Chapter of Christian Youth Theatre productions of *Wizard of Oz* and *Les Miserable*. Walker's most recent musical adventure took him across the pond in January to St. Petersburg, Russia to accept the honor of guest conductor at *Epiphany Nights Musical Festival*. Walker and his family are proud to call Jackson home and love being part of this diverse community.

DINEIJAH ATTIDORE-CHARLES (Woodwinds) was born on the island of St. Thomas, USVI and is currently a junior at Jackson State University. She is the principle flautist in the Jackson State University Symphonic Wind Ensemble as well as the orchestra and also plays the baritone saxophone in Jazz Ensemble II.

THE PRODUCTION STAFF

RUPERT HOLMES (Book) has won Tony®awards as playwright, lyricist and composer. Broadway: *The Mystery of Edwin Drood* (Tony® award winner for Best Musical and Tony® awards to Holmes for Best Score and Best Book); *Curtains* (with Kander and Ebb, Tony nom. Best Musical, Drama Desk Award to Holmes for Best Book, Tony® nom. for Book and Additional Lyrics); *Say Goodnight, Gracie* (Tony® nomination to Holmes for Best Play); Broadway thrillers include *Accomplice* (Edgar Award) and his adaptation of John Grisham's *A Time to Kill*. Regional: *The Nutty Professor* (book and lyrics, with music by Marvin Hamlisch, 2012 BroadwayWorld "Best Musical"). TV: created and wrote AMC's Emmy-winning *Remember WENN*. Holmes is also an award-winning mystery novelist...wrote, arranged and conducted platinum albums for Barbra Streisand including his songs for the Golden Globe-winning score of *A Star is Born*. Holmes is himself a platinum hit singer-songwriter of the seventies and eighties, and the recent recipient of ASCAP's prestigious George M. Cohan award "for the breathtaking diversity of his creative career."

MELISSA MANCHESTER (Composer) starred in the national tours of Andrew Lloyd Webber's *Music of the Night* and *Song and Dance*. She also created the role of Maddy on the NBC television hit series *Blossom*. In 1980 she became the first recording artist in the history of the Academy Awards to have two nominated movie themes in a given year: "Through The Eyes Of Love" and "The Promise." She was nominated for a Grammy® Award in 1980 for "Don't Cry Out Loud" and won the Grammy® Award for best female vocalist in 1982 singing "You Should Hear How She Talks About You." In addition to performing, Manchester has composed music for the animated feature *The Great Mouse Detective* and written the scores for the musical *I Sent a Letter to My Love* and for *Lady and the Tramp II*, the sequel to the Disney animated classic. Manchester also co-wrote the radio mainstays "Midnight Blue", "Come In From The Rain" and

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"Whenever I Call You Friend." She was presented the Governor's Award by the National Academy of Recording Arts and Sciences for her contributions to the music and recording arts. In 2015, Manchester celebrated her forty-year career with the release of her 20th studio album, *You Gotta Love the Life*.

SHARON VAUGHN (Lyrics) started her career in music as a recording artist. After being "discovered" singing in a local lounge by country star Mel Tillis, she moved to Nashville from her hometown, Orlando, Florida. Vaughn spent years as an A-lister session singer (Dolly Parton, Kenny Rogers, George Jones and many others) until her first self-penned song became a hit on the Oak Ridge Boys. Followed soon by the iconic, "My Heroes Have Always Been Cowboys", by Waylon Jennings, which was also recorded by Willie Nelson for the Oscar®winning soundtrack of *The Electric Horseman* film. She has over one hundred recorded country songs, including many Number Ones and CMA's Event of the Year with Lorrie Morgan and Keith Whitley, 'Til A Tear Becomes A Rose'. In 2008 Vaughn moved to Stockholm, Sweden, branching into the pop realm with Agnes' worldwide hit, "Release Me". Currently splitting her time between Nashville, London and Stockholm, she continues working between continents and composing all genres of music... including scores for musical theatre in Europe and the US. Vaughn has been nominated for the Nashville Songwriters Hall of Fame.

JILL CONNER BROWNE (Author, the *Sweet Potato Queens*® books) formally trained in Absolutely Nothing, Browne discovered that her only innate abilities are smiling, waving, and forming instantaneous, baseless opinions about literally everything. Along with these dubious distinctions, it was also observed that people willingly mind her directives. She attributes this to their fear of her enormous stature but she is more interested in the obedience itself than the reason for it. Seeing by these traits and skills that she was fitted only for royal office and finding all existing (foreign and domestic) positions to be filled, Browne created herself THE Sweet Potato Queen in Jackson, Mississippi, in 1982 and has done little else ever since. (Other than producing and successfully bringing to adulthood one spectacular daughter, Bailey, and writing 9 bestselling books—3 NYTIMES Best-sellers, 2 of which were #1—Browne has spent years in happy Slothdom in Mississippi, where she is greatly entertained by her husband, The Cutest Boy in the World, Kyle Jennings, and an assortment of large rescue dogs and one gigantic cat.

RANDY REDD (Director) Directing credits include Swing Wings, Extraordinary Joe, Million Dollar Quartet, Smoke on the Mountain, The Who's Tommy, Little Shop of Horrors, and Fiction in Photographs.
